### Health Action Tip

Influenza, commonly known as the flu, is highly contagious – people can spread it even before they know they're sick. Flu spreads mainly person-to-person when infected people cough or sneeze. A few simple, everyday steps will help you stay healthy and protected from the flu virus:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
- Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand sanitizers are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread that way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- **Stay home if you become sick.**
