Welcome to the "One ISP"

In 2013, the Office of Developmental Disability Services (ODDS) was approached by the DD Coalition (a wide-reaching stakeholder community) with a recommendation that Oregon move from 11 different Individual Support Planning tools and processes to one for all people with Intellectual or Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) receiving Medicaid-funded services.

ODDS agreed, and shortly thereafter a contract with Oregon Technical Assistance Corporation (OTAC) was made for state-wide implementation. This effort began in January 2015 and OTAC is facilitating the regional trainings to set the One ISP into use for all PAs and Service Coordinators. All new or renewal Individual Support Plans (ISPs) developed after April 1, 2015 will use the One ISP process and materials.

There are many benefits of the One ISP, including using person centered planning regardless of the type of services received or setting in which a person lives, a more comprehensive document that addresses all areas of need met by both paid and natural supports, a focus on the client's desired outcomes, and it being a "living document" that reflects ongoing changes throughout a plan year.

The process of person-centered planning will continue to be client driven and focused. This is at the core of the One ISP. Person-centered tools will now be a part of the One ISP such as the One Page Profile. Additionally, documentation related to known risks will be a part of the One ISP and will need to specify how these risks will be addressed. In alignment with the Employment First Initiative, career development planning will also be addressed in the One ISP with specific goals and action steps to meeting these goals.

Overall, the One ISP may look slightly different from what you are used to seeing and using, but the process and the context will remain consistent to what you are used to visiting with your PA.
