Help To Heal

The Trauma Healing Project (THP), located at 2222 Coburg Road in Eugene, helps people heal from all kinds of pain such as abuse, violence and the emotional suffering left from physical injury. They do it by helping people find creative ways to express their pain through film. A team of trained staff works with people to express their trauma by producing mini-movies that tell the tale of their injury and this expression helps the individual face, overcome and heal from the hurt. Full Access is working on a collaborative effort to make this project available to our clients with specialized support to help them succeed!

A select team of Full Access staff members will work with the THP staff to generate a support model designed to help our clients make their own films of self discovery and healing. The support will be customized to help individuals with developmental disabilities express and heal from the grief they feel from traumatic pain they've suffered. Each person's pain and the films made to express and heal from it will be unique, as will the support each person will need to generate their own mini-movie of self discovery and healing.

To get the support needed to find healing through film with the THP, one must be willing to commit to about 40 hours of work, gathering, editing and compiling materials such as photos, music and commentary that become part of their personal movie about their pain and healing experience. The work takes place at the THP, generally over the course of a few days. The time is needed to take all the information gathered and condense it into a mini-movie running about 1-2 minutes.

There will only be availability for about nine clients for the first round of movie-making sessions, but if it goes well, future opportunities may be available to others. The initial sessions to generate mini-movies are expected to begin May 2012. For more information contact your PA at Full Access.
